

1. Melodic

- 1.1. Maintaining Shruthi: Ensuring accurate pitch or musical tone.
- 1.2. Maintaining Swarasthanas: Maintaining the correct positions of musical notes.

2. Rhythmic

- 2.1. Laya: The tempo or rhythmic speed.
- 2.2. Kaalapramana: The measure of rhythmic time cycles.
- 2.3. Taalanga Indication: Precise indication of rhythmic patterns.

3. Vocal

- 3.1. Timbre: The unique quality or tone colour of a voice.
- 3.2. Agility: The ability to perform rapid musical passages with ease.
- 3.3. Range: The span of notes or pitches a voice can produce.

LEVEL PRATHAMA

Course Level: Level Prathama (50 hrs)

> Course Description for Voice Culture and Instrumental Technique:

Karnataka Sangita Level Prathama is designed for practical application, emphasizing a balanced approach to aural skills. The curriculum aims to deepen the understanding of Shruthi and Taala, with a basic grasp of the history of Karnataka Sangita, involving recognition of Sri. Purandaradasa and Thrimoorthy, along with other composers relevant to the compositions learnt throughout the course.

Instrumental Technique Variations:

For Instrumentalists, the syllabus variations are seamlessly integrated, allowing students to apply learnt concepts on their respective instruments.

The variations from Vocals for an instrument emphasize on:

- Tuning the instrument.
- Playing Tristhayi (3 Octaves Mandrasthayi Shadja to Athithaarasthayi Shadja).
- Developing a distinctive execution style for both Swaras and Sahithya for a given composition.
- Recitation of Sahithya by the instrumentalist.

> PreparatoryRequirements:

The candidate should prepare according to the Karnataka Sangita Samvardhana syllabus. Candidates may pursue more lessons of their choice but are strictly required to fulfil the syllabus requirements. Instrumentalists will have to bring their own instruments and follow the syllabus accordingly. Candidates are strictly not allowed to refer to any books during examination.

- Achieving fluidity over melodic variations of Swaras with respect to octaves (Sthaayis).

5.Basic History

A brief history of Shri Purandaradasa (Karnataka Sangita Pithamaha) & Thrimoorthy.

> Evaluation Mode and Examination

Analysis of the practical prospects of the candidate's rendition or performance is conducted, encompassing the identification of Swaras, Taalas, Raagas and proper enunciation of Sahithya within the syllabus scheme. This also involves recognizing upper or lower octave Swaras and identifying the Aadhara Shadja of a chosen pitch. Additionally, maintaining Kaalapramana and understanding the logic behind Kaalas (Speed system) are crucial aspects assessed during the evaluation. Furthermore, in the case of instruments, consideration is given to instrumental tuning and the distinctive quality of Swaras and Sahithya, taking into account varied parameters.

This involves a comprehensive grasp over Raagas, Taala and compositions within the syllabus scheme, including maintaining kaalapramana of rendered compositions. In the case of instruments, the instrumental tuning and distinctive quality of Swaras and Sahithya of the same composition are taken into account, along with other instrumental parameters.

Course Description for Voice Culture and Instrumental Technique

Through this exploration, the students will not only augment their expertise but also cultivate a sophisticated acumen for attentive listening.

Instrumental Variations

Instrumental intricacies are seamlessly infused into the curriculum, enabling students to adeptly apply mastered concepts on their respective instruments. The adaptations from Vocal training for an instrument underscore:

- Exquisitely refining the instrument to possible perfection.
- Cultivating a distinctive execution style for both Swaras and Sahithya within a specified composition, and implementing the concepts with utmost precision and finesse.
- Recitation of Sahithya by the instrumentalist.

Preparatory Requirements

The candidate should prepare according to the **Karnâtaka Sangîta Samvardhana Level Unnatha** syllabus. Candidates have the flexibility to explore additional lessons based on their interests, yet it is imperative that they diligently meet the syllabus requirements. Instrumentalists have to bring their own instruments and follow the requirements outlined in the syllabus. Candidates are not allowed to refer to any books during the examination.
